1975 A Proposed Early to Middle Woodland Ceramic Sequence for the Delmarva Peninsula. *Maryland Archaeology* 11(1):21-29.

The author examined collections from Maryland and Delaware in an attempt to create a sequence of prehistoric ceramic development on the Delmarva Peninsula. In terms of Middle Woodland period pottery, she states that an untempered type she defined from the Coulbourn site in south Kent County, Delaware, called Coulbourn Net-Impressed, closely resembles Popes Creek Net-Impressed wares from the Potomac Valley. Some of the Coulbourn wares also have finely crushed shell, resembling Mockley ware. A radiocarbon date of 200 ± 90 A.D. (I-6060) was obtained for such a net-impressed sherd at the Carey Farm site in Kent County. A similar sherd, recovered from a pit at the Hughes-Willis site, also in Kent County, was dated to 300 ± 110 A.D. (I-5817).
